December 13, 1918 - September 4, 2015

Charlotte May Costello (nee Futterer), 96, was born in Minot, North Dakota on December 13, 1918, to Charles Futterer and Kathryn (Donnelly) Futterer. She grew up in the City of Chicago and married Edward L. Costello on May 11, 1940. They resided in Mount Greenwood for over 30 years. Edward preceded her in death in 1997. Together, they raised 5 children, including Diane Kelly, Edward James Costello (Kathy Krips) who passed in 2000, Philip Arthur Costello (Teresa Boris), Thomas Allen Costello (Janice Miller) and Roseann Patricia Ivanovich (Steven Ivanovich).
