“ *My father served during WW2 in the Navy Aboard the USS Wayne. He took part in seven combat missions as a crewman in amphibious assault. He engaged in such missions as Kwajalein, Saipan, Guam, Peleliu, Leyte, Luzon, and Okinawa.*

These were some of the fiercest battles of the war. In addition to the major battles he fought in, he faced the threat of enemy aircraft while at sea. He was part of a four man crew who manned an anti aircraft gun.

On September 27 1944 he was recognized for the Caption's Meritorious Mast, for performing admirably under heavy fire during the Battle of Peleliu, a battle which saw some of the highest casualties of the war.
